ANNUAL FEES TO BE REPLACED BY A TRADE LEVY FROM 1ST JULY

Why?

The CES, which runs our trading system and others world wide, has introduced a fee for its service to cover the costs of the organisation. This is to be paid as a percentage of all trades from our community. Consequently, from July we will be introducing a percentage charge on all trades in line with the CES ruling.

Is this fair?

Unlike GST of 10%, our "tax" will only be set at 4%. Better still, we will be removing the 20 shells annual charge. (There will remain a small cash charge.) For members who only trade a little they will actually be better off under this system, while those who use LETS extensively will pay a little bit more. We think every one will agree that this is fair.

How will it work?

If something is traded for 20 shells: the buyer would pay 20.8 shells, the seller would earn 19.2 shells. Admin would earn 1.6 shells. From this we would pay our dues to the CES and the local Administration costs.

Are there any problems?

Over all there are very few drawbacks to the new system. It will save a huge amount of time for the administration team and will produce a similar outcome. The only issue is that members MUST NOT try to REFUND items as they will be charged the levy twice.

Instead, of attempting to pay back shells the recorded transaction must be deleted. This is very simple for you to do.

FROM THE TIPS TABLE:

Have you ever accidentally entered a trade twice and been unsure as to what to do to rectify the situation?

The answer is simple: **DELETE THE TRANSACTION**. To delete a transaction, login to your account and go to Your Statement.

Click on the green part of the transaction entered incorrectly and then you will have the option to delete it.

If you have any problems let your administrator know.

If you have been debited twice for something, please **DO NOT** debit the other member's account for the extra charge, you need to contact that member and ask them to delete the transaction as above or contact your administrator.

This practice of deleting transactions, rather than arranging a debit from the other party, will become even more significant when the **TRADE LEVY** is introduced.
