LETS Mourns and Celebrates the Life of JILL JORDAN

Jill Jordan, founder, mentor, friend, peacefully took flight on the 8th January after admirably facing the challenges of cancer. She was farewelled and honoured by the Maleny and Bowen communities in ceremonies that expressed great love for an extraordinary human being.

Founder of LETS in Australia, Jill initially heard about the exchange system from a friend, Lea Harrison, who was participating in a Permaculture Design course in the United States. Jill and colleague Ian Smith travelled to Canada to see LETS in action and meet Michael Linton its creator. They brought back the original 'Landsman System' disks and LETS was born in Maleny in November 1987. Other LETS systems soon followed as Jill sung its praises when visiting Brisbane and the Sunshine Coast. Richmond Valley LETS based in Lismore, but serving Nimbin and Mullumbimby, materialised with a ripple effect drawing in Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

Jill's travels saw LETS spring up in rural Victoria and Western Australia. Subsequently, the word spread to South Australia and Tasmania then much later the Northern Territory and North Queensland became hooked! At its peak there were more than three hundred LETS systems in Australia. Some have grown, some folded, some amalgamated, and new groups have unfolded. Currently, there are approximately two hundred systems operating nationally.

The network began to spread. Jill's friends assisted in growing LETS Japan and Switzerland. Michael Linton and Paul Felix (Deloraine LETS in Tasmania) began and helped existing LETS in a big way in the United Kingdom. They even involved local councils!

Jill Jordan was a Trustee and Advisor to Maleny LETS from its inception until she moved to Bowen two and a half years ago. It's a wonder she didn't start a trading system in Bowen but swimming, singing, sailing, and "on the ground" landcare took priority with Jill applying for grants to support local projects.

Maleny locals will fondly remember how Jill was always up for a "stick party". Bamboo lengths were cut and sharpened for the Corn Stall which was a LETS annual fund-raiser at the Folk Festival. She also dressed the part and partied well at our LETS Decadent/Recycled Balls.

Jill will be sadly missed, fondly remembered, and her legacy will live on in the many Maleny Cooperatives and projects planned in her honour.

Hi and a very Happy New Year (Chinese or otherwise) to you all from the LETS team. Hope 2010 is full of joy and abundance for all.

OBITUARIES: Jill Jordan, founder of LETS in Maleny and Australia, lost her battle with cancer on 8th Jan and was royally farewelled by both the Bowen and Maleny communities (story front page). Late last year we lost Yukari Desjardins who was a very active member of Maleny and Sunshine Coast LETS. She would regularly bring groups of Japanese students for "Co-op Tours" including LETS and translated for Jill during her lecture trips to Japan, though Jill was actually learning Japanese from Yukari as well. She died suddenly from a heart condition doing what she loved – a drumming workshop in Japan. We also remember Betty Ringer who passed away recently also from cancer. Betty was an active member who loved the LETS Markets and online CES. She was "Mom" to Sammy, one of our very staunch member/supporters. Our thoughts are with their families.

BUNYA MEALS AT THE UPFRONT CLUB: The Upfront Club offer a "Bunya Special" meal on Monday evenings – muso's blackboard night. There were a few "hiccups" in the beginning but it's going well now. THE HOUSE THAT LETS BUILT

with John Champagne – Bega LETS – LETS National Conference 2008

This is a story of 'Head, Hands and Heart'. It is a true story of community in action when Bega recently took on a huge project which was inspired by Ted Trainor who talked about the 'mortgage trap'. As a result, a Bega LETS member spent 20,000 – 30,000 LETS units (Sapphires) to build a house.



Avril Fink, who was connected with the local Steiner School acquired 5 – 6 acres on the Steiner property. This project was a testimony to people thinking outside the square in areas of child raising, education and many other things as well. Avril was a woman known to be scrupulously honest and was upfront about going into such a huge debit. The decision to build the house coincided with a downturn in Bega LETS. This project actually also made Bega LETS look at the inadvisability of imposing a debit limit on members.

A local builder was prepared to lead the team of workers. He worked with Avril to design the house. It was to be simple, fairly small and passive solar in design. A hydraulic ram was hired on LETS to make the mud bricks...300 to 400 per day. Building in mud brick is extremely labour intensive. Workers were taught building skills on the job. It was a great alternative to the dole involving kids and the elderly as well. There were between two and twelve people on site each day with Avril providing lunch and cuppas.

A huge staircase was cut from a eucalypt on the property. A concrete lintel was constructed between the two stories to suspend the mezzanine floor. There wasn't much concern with WHS issues!! The lower floor was made from mud, puddled and left to set. This was stamped with a tile pattern then sealed. It looked quite elegant. The internal walls were sealed with 'acropoly' and silt...outside with silt and cow manure. There is an enzyme in the cow's gut similar to that in termite mounds which strengthens the mud. Most of the resources came from the site. The house has solar panels for power, a Rotoloo slow combustion stove (this backs up the solar HWS and is fuelled by timber on site) and vegie garden. Material costs were about \$12,000 with the rest in LETS units. Workers then had to cover the layers each night or when it rained while building was going on, to prevent weather damage and scouring. It was a huge relief when the roof went on.

Workers earned between 5,000 and 8,000 LETS units each over the course of construction. They could then use them on their own houses knowing there was a skilled 'building crew' out there. Around 7-8 houses were worked on after Avril's place was built. She is working off her debit slowly by making cakes, children's entertainment, WWOOFing, etc. All involved feel that a lot of Sapphires have been flushed through the system and new skills being learned in the process.

Avril's house had building approval. All was fine with Council and Insurance regulations. Fortunately the groundwork was done by the pioneers of the 70's in challenging the narrow thinking of regulatory bodies. This kind of project could be the answer to the current housing crisis.

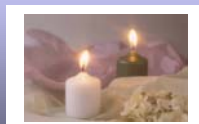
