Important Information about SISLETS

As mentioned in the last SISLETS Newsletter mail-out: SISLETS, NE LETS and Salisbury LETS are now a part of the CES on-line trading system. CES (Community Exchange System) is a worldwide system with groups in many other countries - all accessible on-line. Being a part of CES has many advantages but primarily it enables members to run their own LETS activities – including processing transactions, advertising/updating offers and wants, accessing member contact details, etc.

The likely reality for SISLETS – like most volunteer-run groups – is that it will not be able to continue into the future, expand and grow if it relies solely on one or two individuals to do all the work to keep the system going. With the recent change to CES we now have an opportunity to share the responsibility of running the system. The CES System is also very straightforward and easy to use for everyone. It contains comprehensive information about how the system works and how to use it.

For the new system to work effectively some changes in SISLETS are necessary. Your help/assistance in making this new

system work will be greatly appreciated.

Please note the following changes:

- 1. TRANSACTIONS:** Sellers are responsible for processing (in-putting) their transactions into the CES system. The system ONLY accepts seller transactions – not buyer transactions – so it's difficult to 'put in' an incorrect transaction. If you undertake a transaction with a member negotiate with them who will ensure the transaction is processed into the CES System. Sending trading slips to SISLETS for the Co-ordinator to process will be phased out.
- 2. TRADING STATEMENTS:** Individual statements to members will no longer be included with the SISLETS Newsletter. Copies of your trading statement can be obtained directly from the CES system. To cut down on costs and labour time trading statements will be issued to individual members on written request only to SISLETS for a fee of 5 units (limit of 2 issued per year).
- 3. OFFERS AND WANTS (Resource Guide):** The CES System contains a 'Resource Guide' facility in the form of 'Offers' and 'Wants' sections. The paper copy of the Resource Guide will be replaced with this on-line system. Copies can be printed out from the system when required and you can update your information whenever you wish.
- 4. SISLETS NEWSLETTER:** Will continue to be published bi-monthly and mailed out to all financial members. It will provide a means for all members (with or without internet access) to find out what's happening in SISLETS and to advertise to other members. Each newsletter will contain a membership list so that everyone has access to current member contact details. See page one for 2007 closing dates for submissions to the Newsletter.

Accessing the CES System: Every member was issued with an individual

password in the last Newsletter mail-out – you will need this password to access your account via www.ces.org.za If you do not know or have lost your password you'll need to re-apply in writing to SISLETS for a copy. When you first access your trading account please change your password to one of your own choice.

If you do not have a Computer or Internet access:

If you do not own a computer and are not able to do your own on-line accounting here are some options:

- a. Libraries and Inter-net Cafes have facilities for accessing the internet, emailing etc.
- b. Ask friends, family, kids (who have computers) to do your accounting for you and access your account. Don't forget they'll need to know your password to do this.
- c. Enlist the help of another member in LETS to do your accounting for you and print out your trading statement, etc. (offer to pay them in units or part units/cash). They can also print out a current 'Offers and Wants' list for you at the same time. Some members on email have already accessed and are using the on-line system. Check SISLETS' membership list for members who have email access or ask for assistance in the next SISLETS newsletter. Offers of assistance from on-line members able to help in this area would be appreciated.

Please Note: SISLETS does not currently have anyone responsible for processing and organising accounting. Your individual help to ease the workload by using the CES system is therefore appreciated. Anyone willing to help out with the general accounting and other computer work please contact SISLETS.

Using the CES On-Line System

The CES system contains instructions on how to use the various aspects of the system. However some people have asked for specifics on how to access the most important information, i.e. processing a transaction or printing a statement. So we hope this helps!

Accessing your Account:

1. Go to www.ces.org.za
2. At bottom of screen type in your account name (i.e.SISA0???) and your password (passwords were issued with the last Newsletter mail-out). Press Enter.
3. You should have in front of you: '....(Your Name)...'s Trading Account'

How to Process a Transaction:

1. Go to the middle column of the page.
2. From the list of options choose 'Enter Single Transaction'
3. Open it up and fill in the boxes (buyer, amount, details, etc.). The system is already set up in SISLETS' Exchange. (If you are trading with a Sal or NE member you'll need to transfer to that system to find the buyer). Press 'Enter'.
4. You will be asked to confirm the transaction. If OK. Press 'Submit'.
5. If you have 5 or more transactions you can use the 'Enter Multiple Transactions' section.

6. You cannot make a mistake as the system only allows you to do transactions as the seller (which, for example, is what your market transaction sheet contains).
7. If you have a transaction as you - the buyer (and another person the seller) you will have to refer it to the seller as you are not able process it.

Using the CES On-Line System:

Printing Your Statement

1. At the top of '....(Your Name)...'s Trading Account' page click on 'My Record'
2. On the 'Edit my Account Details' page. First check and change your details if they require updating.
3. At bottom right of this page double click on "View my statement of Account'.
4. A page will come up 'Statement of Account for ... Your name..... It will cover the last 30 days of activity. Change the view date if you want trading details for other months. Or press 'All Trades' (on the left) for a full view of activity.
5. Press 'Print' on right side for a printed copy of your account.

Next SISLETS Newsletter will cover processing your 'Offers' and 'Wants' and printing out a List of 'Offers' or 'Wants'.

Caring for South Australia's Wildlife.....

Fauna Rescue SA

In November 1991 'Fauna Rescue of SA. Inc' was established to give practical help to South Australian Native Fauna – all animals, birds and reptiles that are native to South Australia. Members are volunteers who care for fauna in their own homes and meet the expenses incurred. 'Fauna Rescue' receives assistance from some Veterinary Surgeons who offer their services for little or no cost. Fauna Rescue also works closely with the Natiaon Parks and Wild Life Service, R.S.P.C.A., Animal Welfare League, the Zoo, Councils, Police and other organizations. Talks and displays are available for groups and organizations. A telephone advisory service is available – Ph 08 8289 0896.

Suggestions for what you can do to help an injured animal or bird:

- Native fauna is not tame. If you have found fauna which is tame, this generally means it is injured or sick. If it is injured, and recovers, it may revert back to its natural behaviour, and could easily injure or traumatise its handler, especially a child.

- Keep the fauna wrapped in a blanket or towel and settled into a cardboard box. Put the box in a quiet, warm spot. Do not give it food or water until advised. Contact Fauna Rescue SA on 8289 0896 for help as soon as possible, as delay causes further stress.
- If the fauna has a breathing/bleeding problem, use first aid principles and treat for shock.
- Baby birds which have just left the nest are often handed in, even though the adult birds were close teaching the babies to fly from the ground. This type of rescue is often not necessary. Simply remove the baby bird from any danger (cats, roads, humans etc.), and place in a tree or bush in sight of the parent bird so that they can continue feeding it.
- If wildlife is using your garden or yard as a residence collect information about its habits and habitat by watching it & enjoying its company, but try not to disturb it. Remember: It is illegal to capture or destroy fauna without the appropriate permit.

Included with this Newsletter is a Contact Card for Fauna Rescue SA Inc. Place it in your purse, wallet or car and keep handy when you next encounter a sick or injured native bird or animal.
